James Sorensen has had a lifelong fascination with astronomy, physics, metaphysics, and the world's religions, myths and legends. Cultures around the world feared the planets and worshiped them as Gods. We have been taught these stories are nothing more than superstitions of primitive man.

Modern cosmology believes the dominant force that shapes and governs the universe is gravity. The mathematics of gravity dictates a universe that changes slowly, with independent and isolated bodies. This gravitationally-dominated universe provides no basis for the catastrophic legends and myths of the past. In recent years man has developed more powerful optical telescopes and x-ray, infrared and radio telescopes. We see the heavens in a new light! Man has landed spacecraft on the Moon, Mars, Venus, comets and asteroids. It is becoming more and more difficult to describe the Universe using gravity alone.

A growing group of scientists is reviving a theory from the past, that electricity is the dominant force in the universe, not gravity. We have discovered magnetic fields that span light years, huge jets spiraling out along the axis of galaxies, monstrous x-ray sources, and detailed structure and filamentation where none was expected. Industrial engineers familiar with plasma recognize these features as electrically generated formations. The Electric Universe has ramifications for all of the sciences - astronomy, archeology, geology, meteorology, metaphysics and biology.
